Cesena is a lively town with a beautiful town centre with a peculiar scorpion shape, which was never abandoned and, in recent years, was restored to its original splendour. It has always been a meeting place for citizens, tourists and visitors as well as the venue of many cultural events and shows held here all year round. This is why on Wednesday and Saturday the most visited street market in Romagna has been taking place for centuries on the main square of the town.

A brief history Cesena has very ancient origins, almost certainly Umbrian-Etruscan. It then passed under the rule of the Romans, the most precious evidence of which is one of the best preserved examples of Roman land division. After the direct rule of the Church, under the rule of the Malatesta family, which built the most important monuments in town and set the still existing urban structure, the town enjoyed a period of great cultural and social activity.

The Malatestian library This jewel, declared in 2005 'World's Memory' by UNESCO, was commissioned by Novello Malatesta. It was built on an old factory of the convent of S. Francesco dei Frati Minori but was always a municipal library. It was opened in 1452 and contains 340 manuscripts, some of which are illuminated, which are still today fixed to the reading tables with the original chains (who stole a book was excommunicated); the role of this very big room with three aisles is underlined by the Venetian type windows strategically positioned to give light to the "plutei" for reading. Its structure, plaster, floors, furniture and codes are still today as they were five centuries ago.

The Malatestian Fortress It is one of the most beautiful and imposing in Romagna with its fortifications and restored walkways inside and outside the walls. It is located on the top of the Garampo hill and is surrounded by the Parco della Rimembranza, with walks surrounded by nature. You can reach the fortress from Piazza del Popolo. The charming internal walkways connecting the seven keeps with different sections of the fortress offer a breathtaking view to the sea and were once used by garrison soldiers to take cover and reach any part of the fortress, going as far as the Rocchetta di Piazza and, thus, the Palazzo Comunale.

The loopholes located all along the walls were used to control the internal courtyards. The courtyard is overlooked by the main square keep today housing temporary exhibitions especially on the Malatestian period and by the smaller rectangular keep with a polygonal bastion on one of its corners, which today houses the Agricultural History Museum.
